SECRETARY'S REPORT

CLIENT SERVICES REPORT

Nancy Gallihugh reported that the phone reps were doing well in handling the incoming calls. These calls are for general information regarding MCEF ministries, and a Resource notebook is maintained and updated to use as a reference for current community contacts as needed. If you are interested in being involved in answering the MCEF phone, please contact Nancy Gallihugh at <u>inngalli@comcast.net</u>. Each phone representative has the phone for 2 week intervals. The phone is no longer being used for financial assistance, but is now for basic information only. A notebook of information, training, an answering machine, and WiFi are provided along with the phone. Phone calls just need to be answered by the end of the day.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE ACTIVITY

In July, there were 45 requests for financial assistance and 25 were helped. Karen Tucker reported that the link for financial assistance on the website stopped working at the end of June. After several attempts to correct it, the issue was not resolved, so an email system was created to replace the link. Karen has updated the website and reprinted the MCEF brochures to reflect this change, and it is reported to be working well. It was also noted that financial assistance was given to a family in need to pay for car parts from Jason Wells at Mechanics of Faith. Please keep this in mind as there may be others who have a transportation repair need that can be helped by this organization. Those requesting assistance must live in the 23111 or 23116 zip codes. Financial help of up to \$500 is given once every 2 years, if eligible.

TREASURER'S REPORT

July 2024 income/expense accounting: Income- \$8,467.97 Expenses- \$28,036.82 Acct balance end of the month - \$69,788.83 Acct balance as of 7/12/24 -\$72,376.00 Certificate of Deposit at Edward Jones - \$200,000

The higher expenses in July reflect 2 rent payments for the OSS in the same month, Senior Rides annual insurance, and 26 driver expense checks. There was a motion to approve the treasurer's report subject to audit. The vote was favorable.

HANOVER SENIOR RIDES

During the month of July 2024, MCEF gave 134 (one-way) rides in Mechanicsville and ACES provided 34 (one-way) rides in the Ashland, Elmont, and Hanover Courthouse areas. Overall, Hanover Senior Rides provided a total of 168 (one-way) rides for the month of July. Not counted in this total are 3 rides we gave to OSS clients in July.

2024 monthly ride totals:

MCEF currently has 98 riders. Also, we currently have 32 volunteers including Operations Manager, Aimee West, 4 Ride Coordinators and 26 volunteer drivers. Two of our drivers are having serious health issues and another is recovering from surgery and all need our prayers.

We held a volunteer's meeting on July 25th to thank them for their volunteer work in the Senior Rides ministry. As part of the meeting we updated the volunteers on ensuring the riders are called at the right time, as well as provide materials and discuss safety and liability issues.
