Senior Rides

This program provides transportation to medical appointments, the grocery store, the bank and other personal business for seniors age 60+ who cannot drive themselves. Seniors who need a ride, call our Ride Coordinator with the details of their need. The Coordinator schedules the trip. A driver calls the rider back verifying the date, time & location of the ride.

Riders may use a cane or folding walker for stability, but we are not able to accommodate wheelchairs. Our drivers use their personal vehicles and are qualified through background checks and driver safety training. MCEF provides liability insurance coverage. 2025 Community Impact

Direct Financial Assistance of \$83,444 was given to 180 families for Utilities, Rent, Fuel Oil & Prescriptions.

The One Stop Shop served 333 families for a total of 994 people!

We gave out:

3,283 bags of food

915 bags of clothing

264 bags of linens



Hanover Senior Rides gave 1,823 rides!

Cash Donations were used to purchase:

- Non-perishable groceries, fresh eggs, dish detergent, socks, underwear, t-shirts, toilet paper & paper towels.
- Food items for the Mechanicsville Weekend Backpack Kids Program that provided 4,200 backpacks filled with food to over 200 children in 13 schools.
